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Council Proceedings of the City of Shreveport, Louisiana
January 28, 2014

The regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Shreveport, State of Louisiana was called to order by Chairman Joe Shyne at 3:08 p.m., Tuesday, January 28, 2014, in the Government Chambers in Government Plaza (505 Travis Street).

Invocation was given by Pastor Banks.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Councilman Everson.

On Roll Call, the following members were Present: Councilmen Rose Wilson-McCulloch (Arrived at 3:10 p.m.), Jeff Everson, Michael Corbin, Oliver Jenkins (Arrived at 3:24 p.m.), Ron Webb, Joe Shyne, and Sam Jenkins. 7. Absent: None.

Motion by Councilman Webb, seconded by Councilman Everson to approve the minutes of the Administrative Conference, Monday, January 13, 2014, Council Meeting, Tuesday, January 14, 2014, and Amendment No. 1 to Council Proceedings – December 10, 2013.

Councilman Shyne: Okay, Mr. Sibley, I guess you'll fill in for the Mayor.

Mr. Sibley: Mr. Chairman, the Mayor is upstairs in a meeting, I expect him to come down shortly, so if we could bypass him for now, perhaps come back when he gets a chance to come down to the Chamber.

Councilman Shyne: Okay Mr. Sibley, thank you.

Councilman Shyne: Councilman Sam Jenkins, we're going to start with you first.

Councilman S. Jenkins: Thank you Mr. Chairman. I think we all agree that the Greater Shreveport Chamber of Commerce is a very, very valuable entity in our community, and it's something that we all support. I'm happy to call up and introduce today the new Chairlady for the Greater Shreveport Chamber of Commerce, our own Ms. Helen Godfrey-Smith. And if that's not enough Mr. Chairman and Council Members, she's just taken on some additional duties as the Pastor of the Greater Provision Baptist Church. So we want to (inaudible) for all that have an opportunity to present her own way.

Councilman Shyne: Aww naw Mr. Jenkins. A new pastor? Alright, alright, alright! We need a lot of good gospel preaching in this community now.

Councilman S. Jenkins: And that's what she does.

Ms. Godfrey-Smith: And you've got one.

Councilman Shyne: Alright.

Ms. Godfrey Smith: But to the Mayor in his absence, to the other city administrators, and most of all to this wonderful body of servants. I address you today in appreciation for this opportunity to come before you today and thank you first for recognizing the opportunity that I've been given to lead the business community here in the Shreveport region. I'm very excited about it. Many challenges, but so many more opportunities. There are some things that I believe public/private partnerships can accomplish, no other coalition could ever do. And I encourage you to consider, to be open, to hear some of those ideas from all facets of the community, to find ways for city government to truly make a difference in the lives of the citizens of this community. I stand here today and you've given me a platform and I don't take it lightly. But I stand today because I know that there are part of this community that does not have a platform. They have a voice, but they are like trees falling in the forest, that have been abandoned. And I ask you to remember, the single moms. I ask you to remember those who don't have. I ask you to remember those who are under employed, those who have issues by no fault of their own. There are those in our community, in fact I'll tell you one quick story, and I will not delay your time. But on yesterday, I was in the presence of a gentleman who was diagnosed with cancer last January. He works as a maintenance guy in a Mooretown apartment complex. He has suffered and been treated for cancer for one year. He has run out of time on his job, so when he's off now, he gets no pay. We have a car loan. I have through the course of this year for three times helped him to stay in his car. Those are the kinds of things that we can do at the local financial institution. Those are the things that we are committed to do, and those are the things that I am not afraid to do. But I want to share with you that by federal regulations, do not like that. They say that's high risk. Well, I say that's tough, I'll take the risk. But I want to share with you, I believe there is something that government could do to help this situation. While I can do what I can do, he has done what he can do. It's almost near eviction, but we were able to help him with that. This gentleman is an indigent person, but he works as often as he can. I would like to challenge this body to consider, while I know you give and donate and share and grant to nonprofits all over this city, to consider some direct help for the indigents, true indigents in our community who are the working poor, who have no other options. That guy knew me, so he will not fall through the cracks, but there are so many others who do, and I challenge you to assist if you can when the budget comes around. The second thing is to consider that while I am pro-business, that there are some businesses in our community that cause our inner city communities to lose family wealth. There are situations where the, and I'm not against lenders, but I do not believe that the payday lenders are doing a service for our community. And while I don't see them as competition, I ask you to consider a senior citizen female that had an income of approximately \$1300 a month. She had to borrow seven payday loans. Because she didn't have an option. She paid \$350, 36 months consecutively,

and the day that she met me at our financial freedom seminar, and we paid those loans off, she still owed \$2100, and she had paid over \$12,000. That is predatory and it is not right. We have to come to the table and begin to have these discussions, so that these things would no longer be able to happen in the City of Shreveport. I offer myself again as a servant, I offer myself as a resource, and I thank you all so much for your service. I'd like to recognize my son and god-daughter, my only blood child, but I have some others. This is my stepdaughter, do I have anymore? Oh, my granddaughter, (inaudible) Brown, and then my staff, and all of those that's connected with me otherwise. Would you please stand? I say we work hard for the City of Shreveport. We do a lot of good work, but there is so much yet to be done and I thank you for this opportunity.

Councilman Shyne: Ms. Godfrey, thank you very much. I want to commend you too for the work that you do for Grambling State University, where we have quite a few kids from - - - well maybe I'm using the wrong term. I won't say kids, cause my boys stopped me from saying that. We have quite a few people that go to Grambling from the Shreveport area, and we appreciate the work that you do, above and beyond the call of duty for Grambling State University who educates a lot of our kids. Again, thank you.

Ms. Godfrey-Smith: Thank you so much. And you know Grambling is a dear, dear, dear place in my heart. We'll continue to work there too.

Councilman Shyne: Thank you hear? Alright, any other Council Member have anybody they'd like to recognize? If not at this point again, my Pastor, Brother Banks would you stand and just turn around so they can see your face? Now you all talking about a good gospel preacher, this is one right here. Pastor so glad you could come down. Okay, I guess the Mayor will be down in a few minutes Mr. Sibley?

Mr. Sibley: Yes sir, we expect him to.

Councilman Shyne: Okay, is Ms. Farnell - - - is Dorothy standing on the outside? If so, tell her we're ready for her. Okay. I'm sorry, just before we get to Dorothy, let me recognize who is that? Ms. White and your son? We just want you to stand. He goes to what school over in Bossier, W. T. Lewis, and we're so glad that he's down. This is a part of his Civics project, and he wanted to sit in and see the finest public body in the State of Louisiana at work. And we're so glad that he came down. Councilwoman McCulloch: Yes, I have. I have a letter here before me. One of which was forwarded November 7th, and of course - - - November 7, 2013 to Lawanda Williams, just the employee regarding a property standards matter. Mr. Howard Jones, he indicated that he had placed several telephone calls this week, and he hasn't been able to contact anybody who's been charged. It's gone from \$279.25 to \$750. So I don't know if I need to put these in your hands, but if you could possibly address this issue with Mr. Jones as well as Ms. Lawanda Williams. I'll let you have these. Okay, thank you so much.

Councilman Shyne: Alright, anybody else have any questions for Ms. Farnell?

Councilman Everson: Not a major question, but just wanted to remind and make sure that we get somebody to go out to the intersection where we saw those cars showing up along Linwood.

Ms. Farnell: Oh yes.

Councilman Everson: Just a reminder, I know y'all have somebody on their way I'm sure.

Ms. Farnell: Yes.

Councilman Shyne: Dorothy, I believe that's it. Mr. Sibley?

Councilman Shyne: Ms. Sanders, did you have anything else that you'd like to add?

Ms. Sanders: Now Sir.

Councilman Shyne: Thank you very much.

Councilwoman McCulloch: Councilman Shyne?

Councilman Shyne: Yes.

Councilwoman McCulloch: I put in a request to administration yesterday concerning traffic engineering. Is this the appropriate time to have them come up?

Mr. Sibley: If that's fine with the Chairman, we can.

Councilwoman McCulloch: Because I was expecting that report from administration.

Mr. Sibley: Mr. Chairman, Ms. McCulloch had a question regarding signalization in terms of our traffic signals changing from red to green. And I asked Mr. Harris to have some information prepared. So, if it's okay, we can do it now, or we can do it later, whatever is the Council's pleasure.

Councilman Shyne: It's fine, but Mr. Harris, from now on we want to take care of these during our work sessions. You can come on up now, but Mr. Sibley from you know, we want to start taking care of this at our work sessions.

Mr. Sibley: Yes sir. However y'all would like to do it, we're fine with it. And let me just say specifically, I think Mr. Edgar Rogers in Ms. McCulloch's district had a question about - - - he said it appeared to him that on some of our signals, there is no delay between the light going from green to red at certain intersections. I had Stan's guys look at it and he has some information out about our traffic signals, and why that may be happening, but it's not a violation, and hasn't led to

any particular problems so far. But Stan, go ahead please.

Mr. Stan Harris: Right, the request that had come in was that we add a delay, in other words at each intersection, that we would have the light turn red in both at the same time. And what that does is, it allows the intersection to clear out. In other words when the light turns green on one direction, you want the other light - - - cause people will just jump right into the intersection. So, if you have like maybe a second to in some cases two seconds, depending on what the speed of the traffic is, that gives it a chance for everybody to be stopped before you release the traffic to go into the other direction. And it's a good practice to do that. However, we are limited in our abilities to do that. A lot of that in our intersections because overall we have about just under 350 signalized intersections across the city. And 250 of those are the old mechanical type signals, and we're basically maxed out on what we can actually do with those signals in terms of adding that phase into that signal. Because in order to add that phase into any of those intersections, we would have to take something out, like a right turn signal, or a pedestrian crossing, or something like that. Because what we've done is we've kinda prioritized, we have the most important things there, and so in order to really address the problem, you'd have to basically upgrade that whole intersection and go to computerized controllers, which is what we have - - - we have about 100 of our intersections, a little over 100 of our intersections. And so we are as funds are available, we are making those types of upgrades. And when we can - - - and once we get those funds, and we can make those upgrades, we can. That delay is part of the manual uniform traffic control, and those are guidelines, and what we try to do is go by that for the most part, but we're not obligated per se, bottom line is we don't have the funding to do that. Because to upgrade one of those intersections is about \$120-180,000 each. And again, we have about 250 of those across the city. So, it's not uncommon for not only just Shreveport, other cities, they have the older signals, and that's just a constant problem for us to try to upgrade all of those. But the request is certainly a good request. The fact is the bottom line is this. Based on the funding and I'm willing to do that, we would try to move as quickly through those as possible, but we just don't have the funding to do all of 'em.

Councilwoman McCulloch: Is it possible Mr. Harris you can actually contact Mr. Rogers and share that?

Mr. Harris: I'd be more than happy to.

Councilwoman McCulloch: And of course Mike explained that to me as well on yesterday. You know the cost over \$100 and some thousand dollars per intersection. So I think that's what, maybe that's what's not very clear to Mr. Rogers, that we just don't have the funding which is an issue with a lot of projects in the City of Shreveport. But I need you as the director to help him understand, that we are aware of what the concern is, we just don't have the money right now.

Mr. Harris: That is correct.

Councilwoman McCulloch: So would you contact him?

Mr. Harris: I'd be more than happy to.

Councilwoman McCulloch: Okay.

Mr. Sibley: And Mr. Chairman, Ms. McCulloch, if I may, I think it's also very important, because one of the issues he raised is whether or not it would create liability on the city's part. So I had Stan to confirm that we weren't violating any statutes, or any laws that would in fact create liability for the city. As he said, it's simply a matter of the older technology in those lights. So he was correct in his observation. But there is nothing that he needs to be concerned about in terms of liability because it's simply a function of technology, and money for the most part.

Councilwoman McCulloch: And that is in the Lakeside/Allendale communities.

Councilman Shyne: Mr. Harris, thank you for coming up and we hope that you can get that information out to Mr. (inaudible).

Councilwoman McCulloch: Mr. Rogers.

Councilman S. Jenkins: Yes, on yesterday, I shared that this is a road I would say, probably 3/4ths of it is within the parish and maybe the remaining 1/4th is in the city limits. And it's called Dinkins Road at this time. The ordinance that we're introducing would be a companion to one that was introduced by the Commission to rename that part of the road in the parish as John Petterway, Jr. Drive I believe, and in order to not have part of the street named John Petterway, Jr. Drive and another short part with a different name, this ordinance would make it consistent, for the entire street to be named after Mr. Petterway. I shared on yesterday and just to remind you Mr. Petterway is a World War II Veteran, well decorated, and died at the ripe old age of 102, and his lovely bride is 100 years old. So what we're asking to occur with this ordinance is that we will waive certain provisions (inaudible) waiting period so that this street can be renamed to be consistent. And we certainly would not want to ask Ms. Petterway to try and wait another two years. Hopefully I will get your support on this particular ordinance.

Councilman Shyne: Okay, is there anybody in the audience who would like to speak in opposition to adding this piece of legislation to the agenda? If not, is there anybody in the audience that would like to speak in favor of adding this piece of legislation to the agenda? If not, Mr. Jenkins, I'll entertain a motion from you.

Councilman Corbin: Second.

Whereas, the City has been approached by Bayou to Bay, an unincorporated group of local volunteers interested in protecting the environment, for permission for student volunteers to participate in a project in which storm drains in various areas of the city would be stenciled with educational messages protective of water quality;

Whereas, these activities would benefit the city and local water quality by reinforcing the importance of preventing the dumping of wastes which can flow into storm drains;

Whereas, all participants would be required to sign releases of liability;

Whereas, the activities would be overseen by faculty members of participating schools and/or Sci-Port staff; and

Whereas, all activities would be scheduled and coordinated through the Streets and Drainage Office of the Department of Public Works;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Shreveport in due, legal and regular session convened that stenciling by student volunteers of messages protective of the environment on storm drains throughout the city is hereby authorized, provided that liability waivers satisfactory to the City's legal and risk management offices are executed by all participants; all activities are supervised onsite by faculty members from participating schools and/or Sci-Port staff; the content and appearance of the messages are approved in advance by the City; the times and locations of all activities are subject to the approval of the Streets and Drainage office and are coordinated in advance with that office; and all safety measures required by the City are employed.

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE 1 OF 2014

“In Program E – Water Improvements:”

Increase the project entitled **Citywide Water Main Renewal and Replacement (05E008)** by \$150,000. Funding source is 2007 Water and Sewerage Revenue Bond.

Decrease the project entitled **E. 70th Street Water Main Relocation (10E001)** by \$150,000. Funding source is 2007 Water and Sewerage Revenue Bond.

Explanation: Companion to an Ordinance 1 of 2014, Amending the 2014 Capital Improvements Budget, appropriating the funds authorized therein, and otherwise provide with respect thereto.

This Ordinance adds \$150,000 to the City-Wide Water Main Renewal/Replacement project to be used for the MLK Water Main Relocation project in conjunction with the State I-49 Segment K project. Funding for construction is required to relocate City water mains located within State Right-of-Way as to not impede the road project by the Louisiana State Department of transportation. Funding for the project will be the remaining unspent balance from the E. 70th Water Main Relocation project as construction is complete.

Councilman O. Jenkins: So, are we taking District C money and putting it in District A? Is that (inaudible)? I mean that's something I really want to be sure we're doing correctly here.

Mr. Sibley: It's for the state highway, so that kinda covers everybody.

Councilman O. Jenkins: Okay, because it was the one state highway, now it's going to another state highway is - - -

Mr. Sibley: But Autumn from Engineering is here if there are any questions about it.

Motion by Councilman McCulloch, seconded by Councilman S. Jenkins to adopt Amendment No. 1 to Ordinance No. 1 of 2014.

Councilwoman McCulloch: Oliver, it sounds good, okay?

Councilman O. Jenkins: Well you know Rose, I'm always the one that trusts, but verifies.

Councilman S. Jenkins: This is on for introduction, or final passage?

Councilman O. Jenkins: This is passage. Okay.

Mr. Sibley: Autumn, why don't you go ahead and come forward while they're looking for a further explanation. Mr. Chairman is that fine to have Ms. Permenter come on up and talk about that amendment?

Councilman Shyne: Yes.

Ms. Permenter: As we it was stated, this is (inaudible) construction dollars from a closed project that was on E. 70th when we decided to move the water main to accommodate the MLK water main relocation that the state is requiring. Our existing water main lines are within the state right of way and to build I-49, we need to get out of their way. And the reason for this last minute inclusion is to accommodate their deadlines. They're bidding out the first phase at the end of January. So we want to make sure we're not impeding their construction.

Councilman O. Jenkins: And just a rough order of magnitude, how much do we have initially allocated to 70th, and this is a remaining \$150 (thousand), is that what I got out of that?

Mr. Thompson: Mr. Chairman, the project is closed.

Mr. Sibley: It's closed.

Councilman O. Jenkins: Well we allocated a certain amount of money for - - -

Mr. Sibley: And Autumn, also talk about the state bid, the reason that the adjustment is needed because of the bids that came in on the state side for that particular piece. I think we had a certain amount budgeted. Their bids came in over that, that's why we have to (inaudible).

Ms. Permenter: Yes, we just received a cost estimate for the MLK water main relocation, and it's \$100,000 over what we anticipated over what we currently have budgeted for construction. So, this is to move money from the finished project on E. 70th to that section.

Councilman O. Jenkins: So when we did the - - - obviously the E. 70th budget, we did maybe last year, I mean we didn't obviously didn't have (inaudible) much on that. Now the 49 thing, we had some - - -

Mr. Sibley: Right. Except the state bid came in a little higher than we expected.

Councilman O. Jenkins: Okay, so we put money in that capital project a lot earlier this year or something?

Ms. Permenter: In the E. 70th?

Councilman O. Jenkins: Yeah.

Ms. Permenter: I believe it was bid - - - that was actually before my time, but it was bid considerably lower. And so we kept it - - - the project dollars in there for contingency in case any unforeseen issues came up. We just completed construction this last fall for all our water mains.

Councilman O. Jenkins: And did you know where did we get the however much it was, and I don't know what it was.

Mr. Sibley: For E. 70th?

Ms. Permenter: It was originally Water and Sewer Revenue Bond fund.

Councilman O. Jenkins: Oh, so it was - - -

Ms. Featherston: It was 2007 Revenue Bond funds that were moved into that project specifically for the E. 70th location.

Councilman O. Jenkins: Okay. So obviously it's - - -

Ms. Featherston: It came in underestimate. We don't - - - until the project is actually bid, the engineers estimate, and we have to - - - we can't advertise the project if the engineers estimate is over what's budgeted. And a lot of times, all of our projects are coming in underestimate. But we have to go by what the engineer's estimate is. So usually there's some funding left over, and it gets moved to another project that is similar in nature.

Councilman O. Jenkins: Okay and my question really is, was water and sewer money in the first place, it wasn't necessarily associated with some kind of street project. And it was generated from Water & Sewer Revenue. Okay, and so didn't have anything to do with bond money or anything? Okay.

Ms. Permenter: I don't know where it came from, just to coincide with the state project.

Councilman O. Jenkins: Okay, thank you.

The Clerk read the following:

RESOLUTION NO. 21 of 2014

A RESOLUTION TO DECIDE THE APPEAL BY THE MONTESSORI SCHOOL FOR SHREVEPORT IN CASE NO. BAC-145-13, CONCERNING A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY ISSUED TO BI INC. TO OPERATE A BUSINESS AT 605 EAST WASHINGTON STREET, AND TO OTHERWISE PROVIDE WITH RESPECT THERETO.

WHEREAS, BI Inc. was granted a Certificate of Occupancy by the City of Shreveport (sometimes referred to herein as the "CO") to operate its business on the leased premises having the municipal address of 605 East Washington Street, Shreveport, Louisiana 71104 (the "Premises"); and

WHEREAS, The Montessori School for Shreveport filed with the Zoning Board of Appeals of the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, an appeal of the issuance of the CO, and the Zoning Board of Appeals ruled that the CO should not have been issued and is revoked;

WHEREAS, BI Inc. appealed to the City Council of the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, to reverse the ruling of the Zoning Board of Appeals;

WHEREAS, BI Inc. has reached an agreement with The Montessori School for Shreveport, which agreement was recited to the City Council for the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, on January 14, 2014, for BI Inc. (i) to abandon the CO effective as of May 15, 2014, (ii) to cease doing business at the Premises on or before May 15, 2014, (iii) to immediately and irrevocably withdraw effective May 15, 2014, its appeal of the ruling of the Shreveport Zoning Board of Appeals, (iv) to not appeal or otherwise oppose the revocation of the CO, and (v) to be estopped from appealing or otherwise opposing the revocation of the CO, the ruling of the Shreveport Zoning Board of Appeals, or the action of the City Council of the City of Shreveport taken below; and

WHEREAS, BI Inc. and The Montessori School for Shreveport have requested the City Council of the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, to effectuate, in part, their agreement by passing this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Shreveport, in due, regular and legal session convened, hereby finds, holds, rules and orders that (a) effective

May 15, 2014, the ruling of the Zoning Board of Appeals of the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, in Case Number BAC-145-13 is hereby upheld, ratified and confirmed, and, thus, that Certificate of Occupancy No. COC1300531 issued to BI Inc. on August 28, 2013, is revoked effective as of that date; (b) the City Council of the City of Shreveport hereby accepts the irrevocable withdrawal by BI, Inc. effective as of May 15, 2014, of BI Inc.'s appeal made in that certain letter, dated November 21, 2013, by Ronald J. Miciotto to the Shreveport City Council; and (c) BI Inc. is permitted to continue to occupy and conduct business until May 15, 2014, the Premises under the terms and conditions of Certificate of Occupancy No. COC1300531 issued to BI Inc. by the City of Shreveport, Louisiana, on August 28, 2013.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any provision of this resolution or the application thereof is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions, items or applications of this resolution which can be given effect without the invalid provisions, items or applications and to this end the provisions of this resolution are hereby declared severable.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Chief Huddleston: It's about keeping people safe.

Councilman Shyne: There you go. Thank you Chief.

Chief Huddleston: Yes sir.

Councilman O. Jenkins: And then I'm going to report briefly just on my assignment, but I expect the Mayor may mention something about this during his comments in the Committee of the Whole. We did have kind of a first meeting outlying some suggestions on how we're going to move forward on Homeland Security.

Councilman Shyne: Good.

Councilman O. Jenkins: And the Mayor I'm sure will provide a little bit more elaborate, but I want to make sure that you know that I followed up on my duties that you assigned me.
