Shreveport Police seek missing service animal following residential burglary



Shreveport Police detectives are continuing to search for clues and suspects in the disappearance of a service animal following a residential burglary in west Shreveport Monday afternoon.

Shortly after 12:00 p.m. on August 29, 2016, Shreveport Police patrol officers were called to a residence located in the 3200 block of Penick Street relative to the home being burglarized. In making contact with the home owner, it was learned that somewhere between the hours of 1:00 p.m and 7:00 a.m. the previous day, the residence had been forcefully entered and items removed.

Discovered among the missing items, was the home owner's service dog. The dog, named "Major", is a specially trained Rottweiler, trained to understand sign language. "Major" bares all the markings of a traditional Rottweiler; however he has a distinctive long tail and bares a white patch in his chest, making him relatively easy to spot.
